## ACM Open Author eRights Experience

Welcome to ACM Open!

It is extremely important that your authors are listed as the corresponding author and use their institutional email address when submitting their work, so they are provided with the correct ACM Open eRights forms.

- Submission to an ACM journal
- Acceptance to an ACM journal
- Acceptance to an ACM conference or ICPS conference

Congratulations on having your paper accepted into the proceedings of 2024 ICPS Conference. Your paper will be published open access, in line with ACM's new publishing model for the International Conference Proceedings Series (ICPS). Because you are affiliated with an institution in a country that qualifies for a geographic waiver, you are not required to pay the ACM article processing charge (APC).
